


Who We Are

Our church building, a focal point of the community, was consecrated in 1910 and has been maintained over the years, but is now in need of refurbishment and repair which we have begun to start addressing.




What We Offer





Who We Expect

- To strengthen our partnerships with neighbouring parishes.






Deanery & Diocese

- Crumpsall is a vibrant, diverse area with a growing population of 18,000.
- Around 70% of the population are from minority ethnic backgrounds.
- Around 55% of the population are Muslim, 25% Christian and 6% Jewish.
- It is home to North Manchester General Hospital, currently undergoing improvement works
- There are two primary schools, as well as a Roman Catholic church and Methodist church.
- The largest public space is Crumpsall Park which is well used and maintained
- Has two tram stops within 15 minute walk. Crumpsall (9min) and Abraham Moss (13 min)
- Served by major bus routes connecting Crumpsall to central Manchester, Bury, Salford, Oldham and Ashton-Under-Lyne

Church Repair

Following our latest Quinquennial it is evident that the Church is in need of significant repair over the next few years. The estimated costs are significant. But this gives an opportunity to re-order the church in a way to suit a modern population



Low Growth

We have been able to sustain our congregation numbers, but our aim is to grow. There has been renewed enthusiasm recently as part of our work to renovate the church and gather feedback from the community.



Hall Repair

Both buildings were built at a similar time and as such have similar repair needs. The hall being in full time use receives more wear and tear than the church, and being two storeys presents additional challenges. We have the opportunity and necessity to upgrade the hall in a way to suit the needs of its users.



Aging congregation

Support For The Priest


We currently operate a small team and PCC to provide our 2 services a week and calendar of events.

Assistance will be provided in creating rotas for readers and service support.

We employ an admin assistant for 10 hours a week to help with parish administrative activities such as writing of our weekly pew sheet, newsletter and monthly magazine, as well as assisting with running the hall.

We also have a caretaking agreement with Rainbow Surprise who operate the foodbank in the parish hall to provide cleaning and maintenance services and handle hall bookings.
