


Welcome

Now in the early stages of this interregnum the congregation here at St Mary's are faced with an exciting yet uncertain period in our long history knowing that at the end of this interregnum, we will be part of a benefice in plurality with our brothers and sisters in the parishes of St Paul and St Peter Westleigh.

Change is always worrying but at St Mary's we are working positively to help bring in these changes. Our aim is to bring about greater communication and interaction between the three churches as we continue to work together to further God's kingdom here in Leigh town centre and outlying areas.

Whilst the church is mentioned in 13th cent. documents, the actual date of its foundation is not known. Before the creation of daughter churches in the 19th century St Mary's was and still is known locally as the 'Parish Church' and central to civic services and large community events.

St Mary's practices traditional Anglican worship central to catholic, and we uphold and respect our traditional roots. We are the town centre church of Leigh and the focus of many civic events.

Going into the interregnum we have had to make slight changes to the pattern of services. We hope and pray that some could be reinstated.

We have positive links with three schools who regularly use the church for worship and other activities.

With the cost-of-living crisis faced by many in our parish we are looking to how we can expand our mission into the community.

Along with many churches today finance is becoming an area of concern. The PCC take a positive approach in this area, committed to paying our Parish Share.

Leigh St Mary's are ready for fresh eyes, fresh thoughts, and at the end of this interregnum fresh ways to lead us forward and bring together all the different ideas to be found in the new united benefice.

Our prayers are with all who may be considering this vacancy.

The Town of Leigh



Situated in the heart of the northwest just off the east Lancashire Road. 40 min by car to travel to Manchester and 45 mins to Liverpool The M6, M60 and M61 motorways are all less than 15 min away.

Leigh developed from mainly farmland to an Industrial town during the 18 and 19th centuries, cotton, silk, coal and engineering being the main industries on which the town grew. Famous for its

own cheese and rope making industry, all have now ceased to be. The Parish of St Mary's numbers some 10.636 and covers the town centre shopping area with much of the housing being Victorian terraced. These are gradually being replaced with modern housing.

Parts of the town have higher scores than average on several measures of deprivation, including low income, unemployment, poor health, education and crime. (source: ukloalarea,com). The Bridgewater canal borders one side of the parish and the town bypass another.

The Church building and attached Vestry

We have recently marked the 150th anniversary of the present church's consecration after the completion of the rebuilding of the main body of the church. The interior of the tower is 15th century with the exterior clad to match the new building.

It is thought that there could have been a church on the site of site Mary's in Norman times.

A grade II* listed building it is Victorian perpendicular built in ashlared sandstone by Paley and Austin of Lancaster.

The church has a splendid Harrison organ dated 1910. After the latest refurbishment the seating capacity is 480. There are no other Anglican places of worship within the parish.

The Vestry

An addition to the main body of the church the vestry is used also for parish meetings meetings, and local community groups use it to hold their meetings. Sunday school is held here whilst the main service is taking place.

Worship

Sunday Worship

Currently our Sunday morning service of Sung Holy Communion is held at 9.30am. Our 9.30am service follows a traditional style, with hymns led by the choir. At this service we use the liturgy of Common Worship Order One in Traditional Language.

Both the president and the chalice assistant robe for the Communion service (we have a full set of stoles and chasubles)

The services are printed in booklets and vary in detail according to the liturgical seasons. We use the 'Hymns Old and New' hymn book and pew sheets for those who like to follow the readings. Communion is distributed from the chancel steps. Readings and Intercessions are led by a member of the congregation. We have introduced a Prayer and Praise Service also at 9.30am should there be no clergy available.

Wednesday

9.30am Said service of Holy Communion (BCP) alternating with Morning Prayer (for the duration of the interregnum)

Organ, Choir and Bells

The Harrison Organ is well maintained and regularly serviced. We also have an electronic organ wired into the sound system.

The Choir is finding new popularity and can sometimes reach twelve in number. During the administration of communion, they will sing hymns and choral pieces accompanied by the piano. They sing for Sunday worship, weddings, on occasion funerals and other services during the year.

Sunday School

Sunday School is held in The Vestry most Sundays throughout the year, whilst the service is taking place. Here children of all ages learn



about the gospel through arts and crafts activities. As part of the children's teachings, they go into church before the end of the service and showcase what they have been learning about to the congregation. The children really enjoy this part. Sunday School is run by dedicated members of the church who encourage the younger members of the congregation to develop their faith.
